**Our Mission:**

Our mission is to assist adult and child survivors of domestic violence, rape, sexual assault and trafficking; to prevent the incidence of these crimes through education and services; and to raise community awareness of the need for justice and compassion for victims.

Established in 1976 Victims Information Bureau of Suffolk (VIBS) has been a pioneer in the domestic violence and rap crisis movements.
